Cristina Roldão is a sociologist and researcher at CIES-IUL, and she completed her PhD in Sociology at ISCTE-IUL. In her recent work, and mainly through the analysis of official statistics, she has been drawing a portrait of students of Afro-descendent in the Portuguese educational system, from primary to higher education, but also in other spheres of society (work, habitation and judicial system). One of the topics she's developing in her research are the national and local processes of school segregation, understood as forms of institutional racism. She has been engaged in the public debate about racism, the collection of ethno-racial data and affirmative action policies for Afro-descendants in Portugal.

Iolanda Évora is a social psychologist, associated researcher in CEsa/ISEG, ULisboa and professor at ISEG (Master Cooperação e Desenvolvimento Internacional). She has conducted research on migration, diaspora, gender, and organizational and work processes. She edited the e-book "Diáspora cabo-verdiana. Temas em debate" and co-edited the books "Género e Migrações Cabo-Verdianas", "In Progress, Ciências Sociais e Desenvolvimento" (I e II), Trabalho, sociabilidade e geração de rendimento no espaço lusófono", and "As Ciências Sociais em Cabo Verde. Temáticas, abordagens e perspectivas teóricas". She published in the book "Os saberes da cura. Antropologia da doença e práticas terapêuticas" (2009).

Miguel Vale de Almeida, Director of Department of Anthropology in ISCTE-IUL, is an anthropologist (CRIA) who has done research in Portugal, Spain, Brazil and Israel, on gender and masculinity, 'race' and postcolonialism, sexual orientation, and the relation between diaspora and the nation-state. He is the author of, among other books, of An Earth-Colored Sea: 'Race', Culture, and the Politics of Identity in the Post-Colonial Portuguese-speaking World (Berghahn Books, 2004).

Patrick Simon, Director of research at INED (Institut National d'Etudes Démographiques) and researcher at the Center of European Studies (CEE, Sciences Po). He works on antidiscrimination policies, ethnic classification and the integration of ethnic minorities in Europe. He chaired the scientific panel "Integration of immigrants" at the IUSSP (International Union for the Scientific Studies of Population), was at the Scientific Board of the Fundamental Rights Agency of the European Commission (Vienna, 2008-2013), and was a PI of the survey Trajectories and Origins (2008-2009, INED, Insee). Edited recently with V.Piché a special issue of Ethnic and Racial Studies: «Accounting for ethnic and racial diversity: the challenge of enumeration» (35:8, 2012) and with Nancy Foner (2015) Fear, Anxiety and National Identity: Immigration and belonging in North-America and Western Europe, NY, Russel Sage Foundation.

Rui Pena Pires, is the Scientific Coordinator of the Observatório da Emigração (The Emigration Observatory, ISCTE-IUL), sociologist, works on migration studies and sociological theory. Author, among other books, of Migrações e Integração (Migration and Integration, 2003) and member of the editorial board of the journal Social Forces. Former member of the Board of the Fundamental Rights Agency (European Commission).
